

Marlborough Community Fridge

Tucked down in the George Lane car park, the Community Fridge is open on Thursday, Friday and Saturday mornings from 9am.

It is free to access and open to everyone to help reduce food waste. Donations are welcome from households with surplus food that is unopened and in date or home grown produce.

You can bring it along during opening hours or drop off in Minal at 1 Honeysuckle Cottages anytime. Since opening in June 2021, the fridge has redistributed over 2.5 tonnes of great, edible food that would otherwise have gone to waste.
