Disaster averted!

A few days before the big flood the remains of a freshly cut tree came floating down the river to Durnsford Mill. It came to rest alongside the sluice straddling all four of the gates which were as wide open as possible. It restricted the flow of water through the gates and started to gather more vegetation and debris causing the water to back up to Werg Bridge in Minal. Along came John Hounslow to save the day! The current was too strong to attempt to move the whole tree. The solution was to cut the tree into smaller bits in situ using a log pole saw, such that they would pass through the gates to be stopped and removed on the other side. It was dangerous. If John had slipped and fallen into the river he could have been a goner. After a tremendous effort he succeeded in clearing the "log jam". Our thanks are to John.

The Flood of January 2024

Friday 5th January 2024 witnessed the greatest flooding of the upper Kennet river in living memory. Minal Riverkeeper - John Hounslow worked tirelessly to lessen the impact on houses in the Minal/Stitchcombe stretch. The pictures on the left show him cutting the fencing below Werg Bridge which was impeding water flow into the flood meadow.

John Hounslow Riverkeeper

The flood has highlighted how fortunate Minal is to have a riverkeeper. John has been seen working on the river for over 45 years! He works for the Savernake Fly Fishers syndicate who in turn lease from Ramsbury Estates a stretch of the river from the old railway line to 400m beyond the Stitchcombe Bridge. John manages the trout ponds which up until the flood held about 16,000 young trout. These trout are "sexless" and therefore when introduced into the river cannot breed with the wild trout. The ponds have to be protected from predators such as otters, herons and cormorants. As part of his job John maintains the riverbanks and vegetation to ensure the river is healthy and flows well for the benefit of the whole food chain and to comply with the requirements of being an SSSI area (Site of Special Scientific Interest). He also monitors and maintains the 4 sets of sluice gates situated on his stretch. He works closely with the Environment Agency, Natural England, ARK and other relevant organisations. The ponds were damaged in the flooding and John is not yet sure how many fish were lost. However, he advises that trout like to swim upstream as far as possible so there could be new fish in the area from downstream. Always the optimist! John is passionate about his work and, as has recently been

seen, goes beyond the call of duty. Lucky us!

Development at Werg Gardens.
